


Garbage Disposal Rules

Separate all recyclables and garbage properly.

Residential waste Residential waste must be separated into four types: burnable; non-burnable; glass bottles and PET bottles; and oversized garbage.



O Garbage that is not collected from the four above groups
Dispose of each item according to its correct disposal method.



2 Put garbage in the designated Fukuoka City garbage bags, and tie them closed securely at the top before putting them out.

Fukuoka City garbage bags are sold in sets of 10 in different sizes and for different garbage types. They can be purchased at supermarkets, convenience stores and other outlets. Fill each bag a reasonable amount, and tie them closed securely at the top.

If the item is too large or heavy for a designated Fukuoka City garbage bag, it must be disposed of as oversized garbage.

Garbage collection may be cancelled when a typhoon is approaching or when there is snow on the ground. Even if garbage is collected under such weather conditions, you are still advised to wait until the next collection day to put out your garbage wherever possible.

Caution

Commercial waste from companies and stores cannot be put out as residential waste. It will be marked as uncollectable with a warning sticker and will not be collected.

4 Bring recyclables to the collection location.

Recyclable waste such as used paper, fabric and clothing can be disposed of at local recycle boxes.

Incentives are given according to the amount collected by recycling initiatives carried out in the area. The rewards obtained will be returned to the community.

You can also check the Fukuoka City Website for information on private businesses that support reusing recyclable items. Please reuse items instead of throwing them out as garbage.

We collect recyclable garbage at recycle boxes located at nine public facilities in Fukuoka City (details below), as well as local community collection boxes and local community group collections (such as used paper collections by children's clubs and local communities), or shopfront collections at supermarkets, electronics stores and other stores. Collection locations differ depending on the item. Check the Recycle Location Map for your closest collection location.






How to dispose of paper waste

Collect paper waste in paper bags or large envelopes for disposal. As long as it is made of paper, there are no restrictions on what type of paper bags can be used.

Close the paper bag with a staple or other means to prevent the contents from falling out when collected. Do not use sticky tape to close the paper bag.





A food drive is a form of charity that collects unwanted and unopened food items from individuals to donate them to organizations that need them.



Efforts to recycle plastics

Plastic items can be disposed of at recycle boxes at public facilities (Pilot project as of 2024).



Items with a length of less than 50 cm per side and made solely of plastic

· Items with a plastic mark 19% (plastic container and packaging recycling mark) are not collected.



Private operators are encouraged to collect their own plastic containers and products after use, and your cooperation is appreciated.

Business operators that collect plastic (As of January 2024) Unilever Japan Corp., FANCL Corp., Pilot Corp.

· How and where plastic items are collected differs depending on business operators.

Besides offering various types of fun and useful classes and flea markets, 3R Stations also provide services to accept and sell used clothing and books. Classes are posted in the

municipal newsletter, Shisei Dayori, which is published on the 15th of each month.

*You can dispose of clothing without removing the buttons and fasteners,

but you must remove any fasteners from sheets. Large towels and bed sheets should be cut into pieces smaller than 50 cm x 50 cm.

You should not put out small rechargeable batteries and heated/electronic tobacco products as household garbage, such as non-burnable garbage, as they can cause fires or accidents. You must dispose of them as follows.

Dry cell batteries / A Heated and electronic tobacco products



Manganese batteries Alkaline batteries

Heated tobaccoproducts

Electronic tobacco products

Insulate each end of the dry cell battery with cellophane tape before disposing of it.





Remove any filters and attachments from the heated/electronic tobacco products before disposing of them.



Remove the battery from the item, then insulate each end of the battery with cellophane tape and only dispose of the battery. (Only mobile batteries can be disposed of as is.)

▼If you cannot remove the battery from an item:

Dispose of the item as is in a collection box for small electronic appliances. If the device is too large to dispose of in the collection box for small electrical appliances, consult the dealer or manufacture for information on how to dispose of it. You can also use the home delivery collection service provided by Renet Japan Recycle (see below).

Renet Japan Recycle collects personal computers and electronic devices from your home through courier services.

Business operators, in collaboration with Fukuoka City, collect as many as 400 types of electronic devices including personal computers from your home through courier services for recycling.

Size and weight

Individual boxes weighing up to 20 kg with a combined length, width and height of 140 cm or less will be collected.

Fees of 1,760 yen (tax included) per box will apply. Collection of one box that includes a personal computer is free.

Burnable Garbage

Put burnable garbage in the designated Fukuoka City burnable garbage bags, and tie them closed securely at the top.

Size	Large	Medium	Small
	(45 liters)	(30 liters)	(15 liters)

Large bags with no handles are also available.

Eighty percent of kitchen waste is water. Squeeze out excess liquid from kitchen waste to reduce the amount of garbage and prevent bad odors and rotting.

A maximum of ten 45-liter bags can be put out per household per collection.

Kitchen waste

Vegetable scraps, food waste, tea leaves, eggshells, shells, etc.

Make sure all kitchen waste is well drained.

Wipe up cooking oil with paper or a cloth, or congeal it before disposal.



Rubber goods

Rubber boots, rubber gloves, rubber toys, rubber hoses, etc.



Shoes, handbags, belts, bags, wallets, etc.

Metal fasteners and other pieces that can be easily removed should be disposed of as non-burnable garbage.





Plastic items

Plastic bottles for cooking oil and detergent, styrofoam pieces, plastic toys, CDs, DVDs, egg trays, washbowls, clothes hangers, plant pots, etc.

Dispose of PET bottles marked with the A symbol using designated glass bottle and PET bottle bags.



Disposable diapers

Remove excrement.

Bamboo and wooden brooms, etc.

Items should be no more than one meter long and five centimeters in diameter.

The handle may protrude, but make sure the broom is securely enclosed inside the bag.



Pet waste

Feces should be disposed of in a dry state in a tightly tied plastic bag.

Empty* disposable lighters

*Make sure the lighter is empty by pressing on the lever (and keeping it down with an elastic band or cellophane tape) away from open flames in a well-ventilated area to empty out any remaining contents.



Japanese-style futon mattresses and blankets

*Garbage that is small and light enough to fit into a designated Fukuoka City bag without the bag breaking.

Electrically heated rug

Remove the electric cable, and dispose of it in a non-burnable garbage bag.

- Liquids cannot be collected as they may spill onto the street during collection.
- O Do not incinerate garbage yourself! Correctly separate garbage and put it out for collection. Privately burning garbage is forbidden by law.



Non-Burnable Garbage

Put non-burnable garbage in the designated Fukuoka City non-burnable garbage bags, and tie them closed securely at the top.

Dispose of empty glass bottles in designated glass bottle and PET bottle bags (see page 9). Glass containers placed in the non-burnable garbage bags will not be recycled. They will be treated as garbage and buried in landfills.

A maximum of ten 45-liter bags can be put out per household per collection.

Empty aluminium and steel cans

Porcelain and ceramics



Bowls, plates, ornaments, flowerpots, etc.

Umbrellas and golf clubs

Items should be no more than one meter long and five centimeters in diameter.



The item may protrude, but make sure to close the bag securely.

Home appliances

Toasters, rice cookers, electric Fans, printers, etc.



If the item is too large or heavy for a designated

Fukuoka City garbage bag, it must be disposed of as oversized garbage. (See page 10.)

Glass

Cups, plates, formula bottles, window glass, broken bottles, etc.



Wrap glass in thick paper and mark as "危険" to prevent injury.

Glass bottles for soft drinks, liquor, seasoning and cosmetics go in bags designated for glass bottles and PET bottles.

Metalware

Pots, kettles, frying pans, wire clothes hangers, etc.



Kitchen Knives

Wrap in thick paper and mark as "危険" to prevent injury.

Used disposable hand warmers



The items listed below can be disposed of as non-burnable waste, but be aware that they can <u>cause fires</u> if they are not correctly separated and disposed of. Dispose of each item correctly according to the red caution points.



Home appliances containing rechargeable batteries

Cordless vacuum cleaners, Robot vacuum cleaners, Digital cameras, etc.

Small home appliances can also be collected as recyclables. (See page 6.)



Remove the rechargeable batteries before throwing it away. Take rechargeable batteries to the collection box. (See "Small rechargeable batteries" on page 6.)

· If the item is too large or heavy for a designated Fukuoka City garbage bag, it must be disposed of as oversized garbage. (See page 10.)



Aerosol cans and gas cartridges

Insecticide spray, hair spray, butane gas cartridges, etc.



- · Ensure the can is completely empty. No need to make holes in the can.
- \cdot When emptying spray cans of their contents, be sure to read all points of caution written on them, and empty them away from open flames in a well-ventilated area.



Dry cell batteries and coin batteries

Alkaline batteries, manganese batteries and coin batteries (model number beginning with CR or BR)

Dry cell batteries can be disposed of as

non-biodegradable recyclables (see page 6).



- ·Insulate each end with cellophane tape.
- \cdot Small rechargeable batteries such as lithium-ion batteries cannot be disposed of as garbage. (See page 6).
- \cdot Button batteries (model number beginning with SR, LR or PR)cannot be disposed of as garbage. (See page 11.)



- The city does not collect air conditioners, TVs, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, clothes dryers or personal computers. (See page 11 for details.)
- The city does not collect items such as fire extinguishers, pressured vessels (e.g. helium gas cylinders) or cans of paint that are not empty. (See page 11 for details.)



Glass Bottles and PET Bottles

Put glass bottles and containers and PET bottles in the designated Fukuoka City bags for glass bottles and PET bottles, and tie them closed securely at the top.

Empty cans are non-burnable garbage.

Size	Large (45 liters)	(30 liters)
Price per bag	22 yen	15 yen

You do not need to separate empty glass bottles and PET bottles. Dispose of them in the same bag.

A maximum of ten 45-liter bags can be put out per household per collection.

O Class boliles

Glass bottles for drinks, foods, seasonings, cosmetics, household medication, etc.

Dispose of broken glass bottles as non-burnable garbage.

Please take any empty returnable bottles such as 1.8 L bottles and beer bottles to the retailer or to a recycling collection point wherever possible.



OPET boilles

PET bottles for drinks, liquor, seasonings and other liquids with the (1) symbol



*PET bottles are marked with this logo on the label or base of the bottle.

You do not need to remove the cap rings from bottles.



Disposing of glass bottles

Remove the cap and any easy-to-remove labels. Dispose of plastic caps and labels as burnable garbage and metal caps as non-burnable garbage.



2 Rinse the bottles once with water.



3 Crush the bottles flat.



4 Dispose of plastic bottle caps and labels as burnable garbage and of any metal caps as non-burnable garbage.

Collection boxes for empty glass and PET bottles can be found at supermarkets.



Caution The following items are not collected as glass bottles and PET bottles.



Dispose of these items as burnable garbage.

Plastic bottles without the PET symbol

Plastic bottles that only display the 🔁 mark are not PET bottles.



Dispose of these items as non-burnable garbage.

Items that were sold as empty glass bottles and containers

Glass jars with lids for home-made liquor or pickles, etc.





Opaque white bottles and containers made of special glass

Opaque white glass, heat-proof glass, crystal items, etc.

Glass items other than glassware bottles

Sheet glass, vases, aquariums, ashtrays, ornaments, toys, light bulbs, tableware, etc. Bottles that contained hazardous substances or are broken

Bottles for agrochemicals, chemicals, etc.





Oversized Garbage

What is oversized gardage?

Oversized garbage refers to any oversized item that cannot fit into a designated Fukuoka City bag, such as furniture or appliances. Depending on the item to be disposed of, you will need different disposal tickets. Contact the Oversized Garbage Disposal Center in advance for more information. Up to 10 items can be disposed of at one time.



Oversized garbage collection service (charges apply)

If you cannot dispose of oversized garbage at the specified location, you can have the items collected. Contact the Oversized Garbage Disposal Center for more information. (Up to 5 items can be disposed of at one time.) You cannot apply for the oversized garbage collection service online or through LINE.

Price of oversized garbage disposal ticket

300 yen / 500 yen / 1,000 yen

You will need different disposal tickets depending on the item, and the weight and size of the garbage you need to dispose of.

Disposing of oversized garbage:

Purchase a disposal ticket at a convenience store (not available at all retailers).



Write your collection number (or name) on the ticket and affix it to the item to be disposed of. Take the item to the specified location by 8:30 in the morning on the arranged



The garbage will be collected during the day. You do not need to be present for pick up.



Some items may be reused.



- Items without a valid disposal ticket with your collection number (or your name) written on will not
- O You can cancel a collection by contacting the Oversized Garbage Disposal Center no later than two days before the scheduled collection date.
- Air conditioners, TVs, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, clothes dryers and personal computers cannot be collected by the Oversized Garbage Disposal Center. (See page 11 for details.)

Dispose of oversized garbage by contacting the Fukuoka City Oversized Garbage Disposal Center.

Be aware that groups offering low-cost collection services on the internet, with flyers or going around the city are operating illegally without the government's permission. Do not use these groups' services, as they often illegally dump the waste or charge you large sums of money.

[Use of personal information]

All information received by the Oversized Garbage Disposal Center will not be used for any purposes other than for oversized garbage collection.

If neither 1 nor 2 is possible:

• Take the item to the specified disposal locations. (You must arrange in advance.)

· Check with the Association for Electric Home Appliances Household Appliance Recycling Ticket Center for information on procedures.

Make an appointment for disposal at Yamada Denki.

 Use the home delivery collection service of companies that have concluded agreements with the city.

Disposing of waste that is both residential and commercial

- Separate your commercial waste from your residential waste.
- If you cannot separate your commercial waste and your residential waste into separate bags, dispose of it all as commercial waste*.

*When disposing of all of your waste as commercial waste, you may receive a discount on your collection fee from the municipal government if you apply as a home office (heiyō setai) at the Living Environment Section of your local ward office.

Dead animal removals

Dead animals found on roads and in public places are removed for free. Pets are also collected*. Owners are charged 1,000 yen per animal. Contact the Inoguchi Shokai on **2092-671-3895** to arrange a removal.

Free garbage bags for volunteer litter-pickers

Special bags are provided free of charge so voluntary litter-pickers can dispose of the garbage they have collected from public areas as residential waste. Check the conditions for receiving the bags at the Living Environment Section of your ward office. See back cover for details.

Human Waste Management

You must arrange for waste collection if you have a pit latrine-style toilet in your home or office.

- O you move out of a home with a pit latrine
- O the number of residents changes
- O you change from a long-drop toilet
- your company or store needs to apply for waste collection, cancel a collection or notify a change in the frequency of collection





Dry cell batteries

(Alkaline batteries, manganese batteries)

Take them to an electrical appliances store or hardware store in the city or dispose of them in a dry cell battery collection box at public facilities. You can also dispose of them as non-burnable

garbage.

Coin batteries Non-burnable garbage.

Button batteries

(model number SR+LR+PR)

Dispose of them in a button battery collection box at electrical appliances stores.

You cannot dispose of them as non-burnable aarbaae!



Small rechargeable batteries (NiCad batteries, Nickel-hydrogen batteries, and Lithium-ion batteries)

Follow the chart below to find out where to dispose of them.



How to dispose of small rechargeable batteries

Small rechargeable batteries are used in many chargeable devices including smartphones and hand-held fans. Remove the battery from the device and insulate its terminals with cellophane tape before disposing of it.



and waste processing facilities

Small rechargeable batteries can ignite on impact, which can lead to fires during collection and at waste processing facilities. Do not put them out in garbage bags and instead dispose of them in appropriate collection boxes as described above.

Ensure that aerosol cans and gas cartridges are completely empty before you dispose of them as non-burnable garbage. There is no need to make any holes in the can. When the cans and cartridges are not empty, you must empty them yourself before disposing of them. Buy only the quantity you need and use it up within the expiry date to avoid complications when you wish to throw them away.

Do not put liquid in garbage bags.

If liquids such as cooking oil or detergent are disposed of either directly or in a container in a garbage bag, the bag or container may break when it is packed into the collection vehicle, causing the liquids to scatter, which could stain the vehicle or the vicinity, cause bad odors or lead to accidents involving passers-by or collection workers. Coagulate or soak any remaining liquids with paper or cloth before disposing of it.




How to dispose of liquids varies depending on the type of liquid, e.g. chemicals. If you are unsure of the disposal method, first contact the dealer or manufacturer.

Household garbage is collected through four separate methods in Fukuoka City, and is subsequently sorted into nine categories (1) to 9) before being recycled or disposed of as described below.



Final disposal using the Fukuoka Method: the environmentally friendly landfill technique

The ash produced at incineration plants is disposed of by the Fukuoka Method, an environmentally friendly landfill technique, to reduce methane and other greenhouse gasses that contribute to climate change.
