## **Children's Vaccination Program**

You are advised to understand vaccines correctly, and make sure your child is vaccinated when his/her health is in good condition.

In order to receive these vaccinations, children must bring their Maternal and Child Health Handbook and must be accompanied by a parent or a guardian.

## Individual Vaccinations

These vaccinations are administered at local medical institutions from Monday to Friday, unless otherwise stated. However, you are advised to check with the medical facility of your choice in advance, because some places require an appointment.
